I have a combobox which opens when you click on a button (option button)
I can then click on an item in the combo's drop-down list.

This is what happens next.
The clicked item goes into the combo.

But, contrary to normal combos, the drop-down list does **not** disappear.
This is by design. I use a combo selection change event. So, anything typed in the combo will trigger the drop-down list to pop up.

However, the drop-down list is rather annoying (it distracts the attention of users). I would rather want it to disappear as in normal combo boxes, like this:

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My code is already too complicated for an amateur; I don't want to add more codes.

So, I am trying to find if I could make the drop-down list (with only 1 row) disappear by using Sendkeys.

By manually playing with my keyboard, I can make the drop-down list disappear with any of the following keys: ENTER, ESCAPE, TAB, UP, DOWN. Yes, all these keys work manually. Even clicking the combo text with mouse will make the drop-down list disappear.

But when I do it in code using:

Application.Sendkeys("{ENTER}"), etc. ... it does not make the drop-down list disappear.

As a test, I tried another kind of sendkeys, like:

Application.Sendkeys("{HOME}"). The cursor moves to the left, which proves that sendkeys do respond to my code.

CURIOSLY the following Sendkeys do hide the drop-down list, but creates minor problems elsewhere:

Application.Sendkeys("{F10}"). I don't want to use it!

Can anybody help me sort out my problem?

Or at least tell me why sendkeys don't work in my case:

Why Application.Sendkeys("{HOME}") works, but not:

Application.Sendkeys("{ENTER}")
